In her role as a 911 dispatcher, she often took emergency calls of children drowning and later when a family friend lost her child to a drowning incident Hannah became passionate about water safety and drowning prevention.

In 2016 her own son, who was 21 months at the time, was lost near a body of water and it was that frightening situation which led her to seek survival options for her children. After her children completed ISR, she felt so passionate about the teachings that she became an ISR Instructor. Her emergency services background, combined with her love for children and the desire to keep them safe, brings a unique perspective to the mission of ISR ensuring "not one more child drowns" in her community.
